## Moving forward at Cleadon Park

There has been lots happening in Cleadon Park over the summer period. Demolition work has been taking place in Ashgrove Avenue and Park Avenue. This clears lots of empty properties and land will be soiled and grass seeded until it is ready to be built on.

Home visits have taken place to those tenants living on Phase 5 of the redevelopment area and visits will be commencing to owner occupiers homes in September. The first 13 properties on Phase 2 of the project are now occupied and a further handover of properties to NomadE5 is expected in October.

Work to Phase 3 of the scheme is expected to start in January 2008.

# A better understanding of regeneration for local children

Reception children were visited by Lindsay Riddle, Cleadon Park Project Officer and Lewis Rimmington of NomadE5, during the months of June and July.

The aim was to give the children a better understanding about regeneration in Cleadon Park. Lindsay and Lewis devised the programme of activities themselves and chose strong themes of the project as a starting point.

During the first session, children had fun learning about healthy lifestyles. They took part in a game of exercise and learned about the importance of eating fruit and vegetables.

The second week focussed on housing. Children participated in a site tour of the estate and visited the Bellway show homes. The theme of the third week was jobs and Lindsay and Lewis wanted the children to think about what jobs people did many years ago and what kind of employment people do now. An ex miner visited the school and shared some real life stories.

The last of the sessions focussed on communication and different methods of getting a message across. After each session children completed a quiz and put a sticker against their name on a reward chart. All children were then rewarded with a special educational trip to Beamish for all of their hard work. This trip linked in with many of the themes that the children had been learning about.

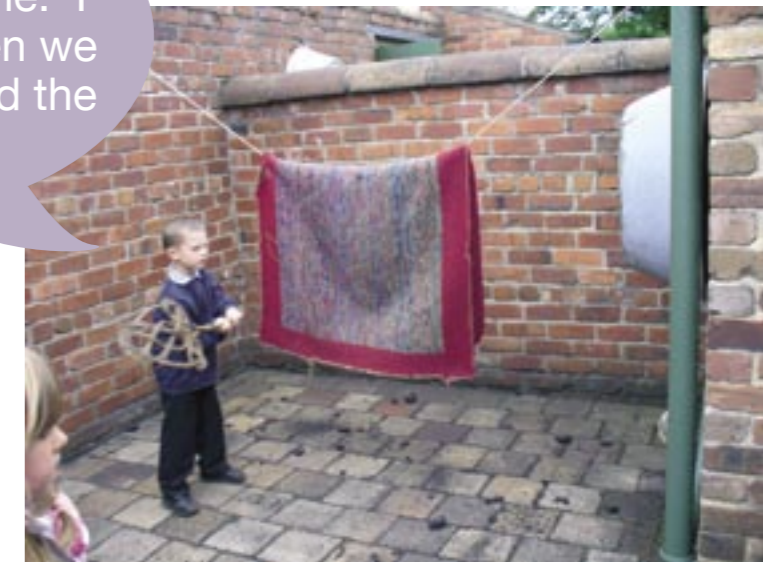
