Cleadon Park fought off stiff competition from other large national housing organisations to bring the award to the North East.

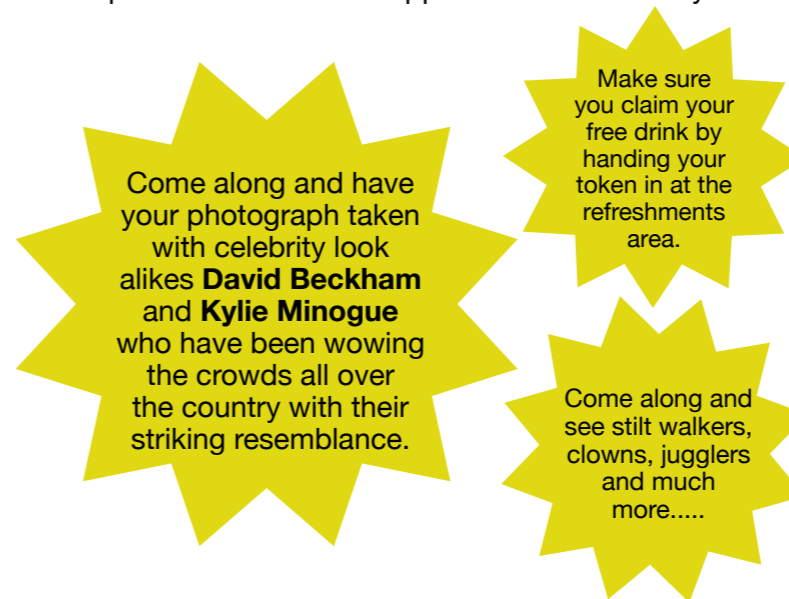
The hard work continues...NomadE5 and South Tyneside Council are now tasked with sharing their successes and lesson's learnt with other housing providers throughout the country.
