Speedy to help educate youngsters!!!

Many of you will be aware that South Tyneside Council's Housing Renewal Team and NomadE5 Housing Association have been working with children from Ridgeway Primary School for some time now.

This work has involved Officers visiting the school for one afternoon for a period of 5 weeks. Key topics such as housing, employment, communication and health have all been discussed with the children.

It is hoped that this work will help the children understand why the area had to be regenerated and what part they can play in sustaining it.

This work has since developed one step further...

Cleadon Park Community Partnership wanted this good work to be made available to as many schools or groups as possible, hence the development of an educational toolkit and character mascot.

South Tyneside Council and NomadE5 Housing Association have been working over the last 6 months to develop this.

The toolkit and character mascot can be used by primary schools, community groups or other educational establishments, wanting to learn more about these topics.

Speedy the tortoise was designed by Steward Coates from South Shields Community School. Steward and his friends have been involved in creating and bringing the character mascot to life and recently visited Costumes with Character in Stockport to see him being made. Speedy and the toolkit were launched recently at an event on the 6th July at the Customs House in South Shields.

Cleadon Park Primary Care Centre

The Cleadon Park Primary Care Centre development is now well under way with the project currently about half way through. All works are currently progressing well and we remain on course for opening in late spring 2010.

The glazing works, cladding and external brickwork are the main areas on which we are concentrating at the moment and local residents will be able to see the progression of these works from the viewing panels in the exterior fencing panels. Internally the partitioning and main services routes are being installed.

The building really is beginning to take shape!

There still remains a lot of work to be done and the number of construction workers we will have on site over the next few months should average 50-60 operatives per day. These operatives are parking at the Temple Park Leisure Centre to ensure that there is no conflict with local residents.
