Support for victims of anti social behaviour

Residents of South Tyneside who become victims or witnesses of anti social behaviour are now able to benefit from a dedicated support worker for the Borough.

Jim McCoy has joined South Tyneside Council, working part-time with the Anti Social Behaviour Unit to provide support and guidance to people affected by anti social behaviour.

Jim will be on hand to support people in reporting incidents and can visit residents in their own home, office or another location of their choice.

His role includes taking referrals from caseworkers, assisting victims in providing any relevant statements, accompanying them at court and providing reassurance at every step of the justice process.

The post has been created as part of the Government's Justice Seen Justice Done campaign. South Tyneside is a Pioneer area in the campaign and has received £10,000 from the Home Office to fund the post until March next year.

When not in South Tyneside, Jim is supporting victims in Gateshead.

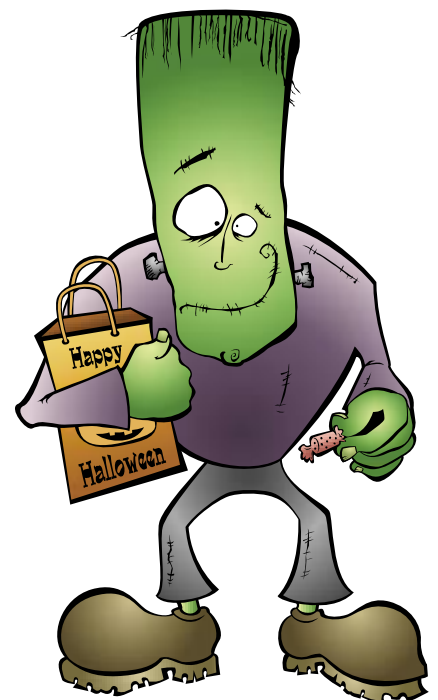

Cleadon Park Community Facilities Update

Work on Cleadon Park Primary Care Centre and community facilities is rapidly making progress, with the external structure now clearly visible and almost complete.

Alongside the building work, staff from South Tyneside Primary Care Trust (PCT) and South Tyneside Council are continuing to develop services to ensure that the centre provides what local people need. The Primary Care Centre aims to make access to health services more convenient and improve the experience for patients. The building will provide a pleasant environment for those who need to access services, which will be delivered in more innovative ways.

Darker Nights Campaign

The campaign now in its third year will see South Tyneside Council join forces with Northumbria Police, Tyne and Wear Fire Rescue Service and South Tyneside Homes to tackle problems around unauthorised bonfires, underage firework sales and criminal damage.

The partnership would like your help in reporting any problems if you see or hear about them, so that the appropriate action

can be taken. By us all working together we can help reduce the fear of crime and the strain on the emergency services and help make Cleadon Park a safer place for all.

As Bonfire Night draws nearer, Trading Standards and the Fire and Rescue service will be visiting local retailers to give advice on the sale and safe storage of fireworks.

Joint patrols to crack down on anti social behaviour

Officers have been joining the Police on high visibility evening patrols as part of efforts to tackle anti social behaviour on South Tyneside estates.

Officers from the Anti Social Behaviour Unit and Community Wardens, accompanied the Police as they hit the streets of Harton Moor, Cleadon Park, Horsley Hill,

Marsden and Harton during the summer.

They spoke with residents and posted leaflets through doors to let people know they had been in the area.

The flyers also provided useful advice on how best to report anti social behaviour and carried messages encouraging victims to come forward so that the authorities can take action to help.

High visibility patrols such as these are extremely effective in providing reassurance to local people and reducing the fear of crime. They also serve as a reminder that we will not tolerate anti social behaviour and we are here to help anybody whose quality of life is suffering as a result.
