New Primary Health Care and Community Facilities at Cleadon Park

You may have recently seen the proposals for the new health and community facilities building, to be located at the corner of King George Road and Prince Edward Road. The new building will incorporate comprehensive health facilities including the relocation of the doctor's practices from Marsden Road and Central, together with a baby clinic, physiotherapy, podiatry, audiology, community nursing and a pharmacy. The Cleadon Park library on

Sunderland Road will be relocating to a new wing of the building and there will be a new Customer Service Centre where Council and other services can be accessed. The Welfare Rights office from the Nook will also relocate here. The building will also accommodate new, multi-purpose community rooms including a crèche and playgroup. The building works should commence in Spring this year.
